Happy spring! Although Mother Nature changed her mind and brought us snow and ice recently, we have had opportunities to take walks and see migrating birds, green grass emerging, and buds on bushes and trees. We hope to take a more formal spring sensory walk on Friday, April 12th, and bring our clipboards along to record our observations. In April we will continue to explore spring with units on weather, the solar eclipse and space, Earth Day, maps, life cycles, and baby animals.

In our Learning Without Tears Curriculum, we are finishing the alphabet with Xx and Qa. Then we will take time to learn more about vowels before beginning word families and word building. The kiddos are doing great matching beginning and ending sounds with the corresponding letter in words. We are excited to focus on vowels to get medial sound practice as well. We will continue practicing pre-writing and writing skills. We encourage labeling drawing and are beginning to write/dictate sentences also. As always in our Mat Man letter books and other thematic books, we continue to think about characters, events, problem and solution, fiction vs. nonfiction, and character traits.

We have had so much fun with our geometry lessons and have moved on to building shapes (making a new shape out of smaller ones), making shape pictures with flat shapes, and building with solid shapes. When we return from break, we will learn how to build cubes and other solid shapes using various materials. The next unit in our math curriculum is adding and subtracting within 10.

There are no April birthdays to announce and celebrate. We hope to celebrate accomplishing our mission to work together and show kindness once we complete levels two and three on our chart. We will keep you posted!
